

2010 Junior, Youth and Masters Windsurfing World Championships

CVM, Martigues, France 24th to 31st July 2010
An International Windsurfing Association sanctioned event

NOTICE OF RACE

1. EVENT

- 1.1** The 2010 **Junior, Youth and Masters Windsurfing World Championship** will be held from Saturday 24th July to Saturday 31st July 2010.
- 1.2** The **Event** includes the World Championships for: Techno 293 Class, Under 17 and Under 15 divisions; and the International Raceboard Class, Youth and Masters divisions.

2. ORGANISER

- 2.1** The Championships will be organised by the Cercle de Voile de Martigues (CVM) for and on behalf of, and under specified conditions laid down by, the International Techno 293 Class Association (T293) and the International Raceboard Class Association (IRC), in co-operation with the International Windsurfing Association (IWA) and the Federation Française de Voile (FFV).
- 2.2** The event is organised in conjunction with the Town of Martigues.

3. VENUE

- The event will be based at CVM. 18 Boulevard, Touret de Vallier 13500 MARTIGUES (France)

- 3.1** Conditions to be expected – winds: thermal breeze; water temperature: from 22° C to 27°C; air temperature: from 25°C to 30°C.

4. RULES

- 4.1** This is an IWA sanctioned event governed by:
- 4.1.1** The ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing – Windsurfing Competition Rules (WCR);
- 4.1.2** The Class Rules and Championship Rules of the participating classes;
- 4.1.3** No National Authority prescriptions will apply.
- 4.2** If there is a conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions (SI's), the SI's shall take precedence.
- 4.3** If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 4.4** Fire fighting planes may bail out in the area in order to put out summer fires. In that case, the organizers and the competitors will have to leave the area.

5. ADVERTISING

- 5.1** ISAF Regulation 20 - Advertising Code- shall apply.
- 5.2** Competitors may be required to carry advertising for event sponsors – both on their sails, and on a lycra vest if supplied by the organiser.

6. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 6.1** All entries shall meet the requirements of ISAF Regulation 19 - Eligibility Code.
- 6.2** Competitors shall be members of a National Techno 293 or Raceboard Class Association, or of the relevant International Class Association. National Associations shall be paid up members of the IWA, which is empowered by the International class to collect any fees due.
- 6.3** Membership formalities can be completed on site.

- 6.5** Competitors shall provide the following documentation prior to completing registration formalities on site:

- Original Entry Form ([Form 1](#))
 - Proof of Entry Fee payment
 - Evidence of valid third party insurance
 - Proof of age
 - Parental/legal Guardian Assent ([Form 2](#)) - *for those under age of 18*
 - Medical Treatment Permission ([Form 3](#)) - *for those under age of 18 or on their parents medical insurance policy*
- 6.6** Coaches and team support personnel shall provide the following documentation prior to completing registration formalities on site:
- Original Coach Entry Form ([Form 4](#))
 - Proof of Coach Entry Fee payment
 - Boat Driving Licence (if applicable)
 - Evidence of valid third party insurance

7. FEES

- 7.1** The Entry Fee, depending on age, is as follows: Junior 120 euro, Youth 150 euro, Master 180 euro.
- 7.2** Entry Fees paid by **June 21st 2010** shall receive a 20 euro discount. Late entries, at registration, may incur a further 20 euro.
- 7.3** The Coach Entry Fee is 50 euro for coaches and other team personnel.

- 7.5** Entries made on site shall be made in cash (euros) only.

8. RACING FORMAT, CLASSES & DIVISIONS

8.1 TECHNO 293 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP (TWC)

- 8.1.1** The Championship shall be a single discipline event for boys and girls of divisions D & E.
- 8.1.2** There may be a separate fleet and start for competitors 17 years of age and older using a max 7.8 OD sail.

8.2 RACEBOARD YOUTH WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP (RYWC)

- 8.2.1** The Championship shall be a single discipline event sailed on **Hybrid** boards for men and women of division C.
- 8.2.2** There may be separate prizes for RSX division.

8.3 RACEBOARD MASTERS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS (RMWC)

- 8.3.1** The Championship shall be a single discipline event for men and women of division G.
- 8.3.2** There may be separate Prizes for "Grand Masters" & "Veterans"; 7.5 and MOD divisions.

8.4 GENERAL

- 8.4.1** Men and women, boys and girls, and age divisions, may race together depending on entry numbers.
- 8.4.2** The Techno 293 class shall race a maximum of 3 races per day, and a maximum of 12 races for the series.
- 8.4.3** The Race board class shall race a maximum of 4 races per day, and a maximum of 15 races for the series.

8.5 AGE DIVISIONS

- 8.5.1** A competitor must have reached the minimum age limit, in the relevant division, by Dec. 31st 2009.
- 8.5.2** A competitor must not be older than the maximum age limit, in the relevant division, by Dec. 31st 2010.
- 8.5.3** A Minim (E) shall be under the age of 15. (Born in or after 1996 and not later than 1999)
- 8.5.4** A Junior (D) shall be under the age of 17. (Born in or after 1994 and not later than 1998)
- 8.5.5** A Youth (C) shall be under the age of 20. (Born in or after 1991 and not later than 1997)
- 8.5.6** A Master (G) is a man who has reached the age of 35 (1974>) or for a woman, 30 (1979>).
- 8.5.7** A Grand Master (H) is a man who has reached the age of 45 (1964>) or for a woman 40 (1969>).



8.5.8 A Veteran (I) is a man who has reached the age of 55 (1954>) or for a woman 50 (1959>).

9. SCHEDULE

9.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 10.00hrs. (15.00hrs for practice race)

9.3 The warning signal for the last race of each day shall not be made within 90 minutes of the official sunset time.

10. EQUIPMENT & EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

10.1 It is the responsibility of each competitor to ensure that his/her board and equipment conforms to its Class Rules, and an Equipment Inspection Form is returned to the Event Equipment Inspector before the start of competition.

10.2 Equipment checks may be made throughout the event.

10.3 Competitors shall bring their own equipment. A limited amount of charter equipment is available, contact IWA office for details.

10.4 Competitors competing in division E of the TEC may use any sail of 5.5sqm, or less, as change down from the 6.8. Any aluminium boom or carbon mast (not exceeding 75% carbon) may be used with the 5.5 change down sail.

11. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

11.1 The 'Championship SIs' will be available at registration, as will the Event Programme scheduling social events.

11.2 Alterations to the SIs shall be approved by the Class Representative.

12. COURSES

12.1 Courses shall be as prescribed in the Championship Rules or in the Sailing Instructions.

13. INTERNATIONAL JURY

13.1 An International Jury will be appointed in accordance with the RRS Appendix N.

13.2 Their decisions will be final and cannot be appealed, as specified in RRS 70.5.

14. SCORING

14.1 Scoring will be in accordance with WCR Appendix B, and using the "Low Points Scoring System."

14.2 RRS A.2 is amended; Championship Rules shall apply.

15. SUPPORT BOATS

15.1 Coach boats may be rented from:TECHNIC MARINE; Tel number: (00 33) 04 42 43 16 10.

15.2 Support boats shall clearly display their national 3 letter country code in black on a white background, either on a flag of a minimum of 50cm x 40cm in size or on the cover of their outboard engine.

15.3 Coaches bringing their own shall register the details, including arrival and departure dates, using **Form 4.**

16. STORAGE OF EQUIPMENT

16.1 On completion of registration and continuing until the end of the regatta, when ashore (other than when launching and retrieving), all equipment shall be kept in their assigned places at the event site.



Removal of any equipment from the regatta site may require prior written approval from the race committee.

- 16.2** Unless otherwise directed by the LOA, all competing boards and equipment shall be launched and retrieved from the designated area at the event site.

17. MEDALS AND PRIZES

- 17.1** Medals or trophies shall be awarded to the first three competitors in each Class / Division depending on entry numbers. Categories to be awarded in each properly constituted division will be posted on the official notice board after the close of registration.

- 17.2** Prizes may be awarded to the first three competitors in each Class/ Division.

- 17.3** The first Under 15 boy and girl in **TWC** shall be known as the Techno 293 U15 World Champion.

- 17.4** The first Under 17 boy and girl in **TWC** shall be known as the Techno 293 U17 World Champion.

- 17.5** The first Youth boy and girl in **RYWC** shall be known as the Race board Youth World Champion.

- 17.6** The first man or woman in **RMWC** shall be known as the Race board Master's World Champion.

18. BUOYANCY

- 18.1** If personal buoyancy is prescribed every competitor and support boat crew member shall wear a personal flotation device that shall conform to the minimum standard of ISO 12402-5 (Level 50). Alternative standards may be prescribed in the Sailing Instructions.

- 18.2** Personal buoyancy is mandatory for all competitors under 17 years of age.

19. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 19.1** Competitors take part in all races at their own risk. The CVM, FFV, IWA, T293 and IRC or any of their officials or representatives or the sponsors or their officials or representatives are not responsible, under any circumstances, for any damage, loss or injury either ashore or on the water either to persons or equipment, which may result.

- 19.2** Participation in this event, supporting events and in each race in them is at the sole discretion of the sailor and at his/her own risk. Notice is drawn to RRS 4.

20. INSURANCE

- 20.1** Competitors shall possess valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1 million Euro.

- 20.2** Coach and support boat drivers shall also have a valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 3 million Euro.

21. TELEVISION AND MEDIA

- 21.1** In registering for the event, competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority the right in perpetuity to make, use and show from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproduction of them, taken during the period of the event, for the said Championship as defined in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions in which he/she participates without compensation.

22. OFFICIAL CEREMONIES

- 22.1** Attendance at the Opening Ceremony, Prize Giving and Closing Ceremony is mandatory.

- 22.2** The organiser reserves the right to refuse entry to those whose standard of attire is not commensurate with the occasion.
