NOTICE OF RACE

Revised May 30 2012

1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2009 - 2012*.
- 1.2. If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.3. Appendix P is in effect except that Rule P2.3 is deleted and Rule P2.2 is modified to apply to any penalty after the first.
- 1.4. **Appendix B is in effect for the Techno 293 class**

2. Advertising

- 2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1. The Organizing Authority reserves the right to restrict class entry. A class must have a minimum of ten boats registered by August 6, 2012, except for the Techno 293 Sailboard, which must have a minimum of 5 entries.
- 3.2. In the event that a class is cancelled due to inadequate registration, registrants in the cancelled class will be allowed to amend their registration to another class, should they choose to do so.
- 3.3. The CYA Youth National Championship Regatta will be open to all competitors meeting the requirements as found in Attachment 1. All sailors must present any waivers and medical release forms signed by a parent or legal guardian at the Registration Check-in Desk.
- 3.4. The following classes are open to sailors born in the year 1994 or later, but no later than in the year 1998:

Laser 4.7	Open (only to sailors born in 1998, 1997, or 1996)
29er	Open
Club 420 (with spinnaker)	Open
Techno 293 Sailboard	Open up to 8.5m maximum rig
Techno 293 Sailboard	U17 One Design 7.8m or 6.8m rig
Techno 293 Sailboard	U15 One Design 6.8m rig
- 3.5. The CYA Youth National Championship Regatta will be a qualifier event for the 2013 Canadian Youth Sailing Team, from which the 2013 Worlds team will be selected.
- 3.6. All Sailor Registrants are required to sign at registration an acknowledgement that they have read and will abide by the CYA Youth Code of Conduct throughout these events. The code can be found at sailing.ca. www.sailing.ca/files/youth/YouthCodeofConduct.pdf



- 3.7. All Canadian coaches must be CYA certified and registered in the year of 2012. All coaches are required to sign at registration an acknowledgement that they have read and will abide by the CYA Coaches Code of Conduct which can be found at: [sailing.ca](http://www.sailing.ca/about/coaches_code_of_conduct/).

- 3.8. Online registration will open on the [sailing.ca](http://www.sailing.ca) and the Regatta Website no later than April 30th 2012.

6. Number of races

Laser, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, Club 420	Maximum 12 Races
29er, Techno 293	Maximum 16 Races

7. Measurement

- 7.1. Boats entered in the Youth National Championship Regatta may be subject to measurement.



- 7.2. As per the Laser class rules, duplicate sail numbers will not be permitted between the Laser Standard, Laser Radial and Laser 4.7 classes.
- 7.3. Club 420 sail numbers will not be required to comply with class rules, but must meet the requirements of Rule G1.2. The Organizing authority will require duplicate sail numbers to be changed.
- 7.4. **For the Techno 293:**
- Sails with more than 3 cambers and/or 7 battens are prohibited
 - Only masts from the approved class list with no more than 75 percent carbon and weight equivalents are permitted.
 - Booms are restricted to alloy/aluminium construction. Note that carbon booms are not permitted under class rules

8. Safety

- 8.1. The Laser, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, Club 420 and 29er classes are required to have a minimum 10 metre long by 7mm diameter floating line attached to the mast while afloat. Sheets or other rigging may not be substituted for this purpose.
- 8.2. All competitors are required to have a whistle attached to their PFD.

9. Sailing Instructions

- 9.1. Official Sailing Instructions will be available at the Registration Check-in Desk.

10. Venue

- 10.1. Racing will take place on the waters of Lake Winnipeg, Manitoba. Course locations will be available in the Sailing Instructions.

11. Courses

- 11.1. The courses to be sailed will be configurations appropriate for the class and sailing conditions.

12. Penalty System

- 12.1. For the 29er class RRS 44.1 and RRS P2.1 are changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

13. Scoring

- 13.1. The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply. RRS B8 is deleted.
- 13.2. Three races are required to constitute a series.
- 13.3. When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's score for the regatta will be the sum of her total race scores.
- 13.4. When from 6-11 races have been completed, a boat's score for the regatta will be her total score less her worst score.
- 13.5. When 12 or more races have been completed, a boat's score for the regatta will be her total score less her two worst scores.

14. Support Boats

- 14.1. Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel (including parents of competitors) intending to be on the water during the regatta shall register with the organizing authority and be identified on the water by a flag. The flag will be issued at the time of registration and shall be returned to the registration desk at the end of the regatta. There will be a \$50 deposit for the flag.
- 14.2. Support boats will be assigned a berth or mooring area for the duration of the regatta. Such berth or mooring is subject to the terms and conditions for all boats using GYC controlled facilities.
- 14.3. All coach and support boats will be required to carry VHF radios, check in with the race committee prior to the first race of the day, monitor the race committee channel, request permission from the race committee before leaving the course and respond to assist if required.



15. Berthing

- 15.1. All boats shall be kept at the GYC.
- 15.2. Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the harbour and/or boat park

16. Launch

- 16.1. Boats shall launch at their assigned ramps, under the direction of regatta volunteers.

17. Radio Communication

- 17.1. A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing, nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

18. Prizes

- CYA medallions will be awarded to the sailors of the top 3 finishing boats overall in each fleet
- Top male / top female crews will be recognized in Open / mixed fleets
- CYA Trophies awarded at this event include:
 - Bill Gooderham Trophy – National Youth Championship (all class winners listed)
 - Interlux Trophy – Single Handed Youth Championship
 - CYA Canadian Youth Sailing Championship – Laser Radial Class
 - Women's Double Handed Champion – CYA Canadian Youth Championship
 - Interlux Trophy Double Handed Youth Championship
 - Fogh Marine Sportsmanship Trophy
 - Other awards may be announced

19. Disclaimer of Liability

- 19.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race.
- 19.2. The CYA, Sail Manitoba, and the Gimli Yacht Club and all other individuals and entities involved in the organization of this regatta shall accept no liability whatsoever for any injury, damage or loss or claim, whether personal or material, incurred or inflicted to participants before, during or after this regatta.

20. Insurance

- 20.1. The competitor is responsible for ensuring that a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 third party coverage is in place for the event. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a competitor is insured.

21. Rights to Use Name and Likeness

- 21.1. In participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition in these events event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the events without compensation.

Attachment 1:

Application of RRS 75 to determine Sailor Eligibility at CYA Events and National Sailing Competitions in Canada

The following items are required to show at registration desk check-in to confirm eligibility to race.

1. CYA member card (and valid proof of age for age restricted events);

Or

2. Proof of membership with a CYA member club or other CYA member organization, or other ISAF member national authority (MNA)*, (and valid proof of age for age restricted events);

A sailor without

- CYA member card, or
 - proof of membership with a CYA member club or other CYA member organization, or
 - proof of membership with other ISAF member national authority
- may obtain a Right-to-Race card which will be available at the registration desk for a fee. A Right-to-Race sailor card is valid only until the completion of the event being entered.

CYA member cards are issued by the Provincial Sailing Associations, who then issue them to CYA member clubs. Directors or managers at the clubs then issue the cards to their members.

Proof of age - the following are valid forms of proof of age:

- Valid passport;
- Provincially issued identification – e.g. drivers' licence, health card;
- Municipally issued photo accreditation that includes full name and birth date;
- School- issued photo accreditation that includes full name and birth date.

Proof of membership with a CYA member club or other organization – the following are acceptable means to prove membership or affiliation:

- Membership card from CYA member club or other organization (or other ISAF MNA) – such card indicating name and type of membership held;
- Official and original signed document (or copy – facsimile or electronic file) from director of the CYA member club or other CYA member organization – such document is to be on letterhead of the club or organization, and need name the sailors and indicate the nature of the membership or affiliation with that organization;
- On-site reference to member list on official website of the organization – such list will indicate full name and nature of the membership or affiliation.
