APPENDIX B

Proposal: After "8.3 Group Racing" add "see Attachment 1".

The 2013 AGM approved the addition of new championship rules for Group Racing and the main points to be included were minuted. Amended Championship Rules were published accordingly. However, the details were left to the Committee to finalise and a proposal has been prepared as Championship Rules - <u>Attachment 1</u>. These rules have been written into the Sailing Instructions for the 2014 World Championships.

It is further proposed that if <u>Attachment 1</u> is accepted "in principle" the Committee may make further amendments based on feedback from competitors and from the delegates/observers at this AGM.

APPENDIX C

Proposal: Delete current 10.1 to 10.7, inclusively; add new:

"**10.1 Arbitration System** – <u>see Attachment 2</u>. The Arbitration System will be adopted at future class championships and will be included in the standard Sailing Instructions".

This updated version of the Arbitration System has been used to good effect at recent championships of several classes. It is further proposed that the Committee be able to further amend this Championship Rule should improvements be recommended by rules experts within ISAF.

APPENDIX D

Proposal: add new:

"**10.2 Discretionary Penalties** – <u>see Attachment 3</u>. Discretionary Penalties shall be made available to a Protest Committee according to a table (**chart**) of options published with championship Sailing Instructions."

Penalties are divided into 5 bands, where the penalties may range from a zero penalty to disqualification. When a system of DP's is used it is important for competitors to understand the process, and the range of options available to a Protest Committee. Rules for which DP's are available are identified within the <u>Sailing Instructions</u> by the use of the code - **[DP]**.

It is further proposed that the Committee finalise the "**chart**" based on experience gained at this world championship and future events. Check out the <u>DP and chart guide</u> to be used for this World Championships.

APPENDIX E

It is proposed that the class review the development of R310 as an "affordable" option by introducing rules that restrict the use of "expensive equipment". For example:

- limit the hull options based upon price
- alumumium booms only
- sails with max 2 cams
- 100% carbon masts not permitted
