1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing – Windsurfing Competition Rules.
- 1.2 The Class Rules of the participating classes.
- 1.3 No national prescriptions will apply.
- 1.4 If there is conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions (SI's), the SI's will take precedence.
- 1.5 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 ADVERTISING

Boards may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. ISAF Regulation 20 'Advertising Code' shall apply.

3 CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

- 3.1 The participating classes and divisions shall be:
 - 3.1.1 RS:X Class – Men, Women, Youth Men, Youth Women.
 - 3.1.2 Techno 293 Class – Junior (U15 & U17) Boy & Girl, Open (A17) Boy & Girl.
 - 3.1.3 Mistral One Design Class – Men and Women, Youth and Master.
- 3.2 **Age Divisions:**
 - 3.2.1 A Junior U17 shall be under the age of 17 (born in or after 1995 and not later than 1999); a Junior U15 (born in or after 1997 and no later than 2000).
 - 3.2.2 A Youth (RS:X) shall be under the age of 19 (born in or after 1993 and not later than 1996).
 - 3.2.3 A Youth (MOD) shall be under the age 20 (born in or after 1992 and not later than 1995).
 - 3.2.4 A Techno Open (A17) sailor shall be 17 years or older in the year of competition (born 1994 or earlier).
 - 3.2.5 A Master shall be over the age of 35 (men born 1975 or earlier) or 30 (women born 1980 or earlier).
- 3.3 **Weight Divisions – Mistral One Design:**
 - 3.3.1 Light weight – 75.0 kilo and below;
 - 3.3.2 Heavy weight – 70.0 kilo and above.
 - 3.3.4 Competitors weight may be checked throughout the event; a competitor must stay within the weight group throughout the event.
- 3.4 A minimum of 3 competitors is required to constitute a division.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 All entries shall meet the requirements of ISAF Regulation 19-Eligibility Code.
- 4.2 Competitors shall be members of a National Class Association which is a paid up member of the relevant international class association, or of the IWA. Membership formalities can be completed on site.
- 4.3 Eligible competitors may enter by completing the attached form and sending it, with the entry fee, to: **Windsurfing Association Singapore, c/o Constant Wind Pte Ltd, 11 Changi Coast Walk, Singapore, 499740** by 30th November 2010.

5 FEES

- 5.1 The required entry fee for all competitors is 150 S\$.
- 5.2 Entry fees sent with the entry form shall be paid by cheque.
- 5.3 A late entry fee of 50S\$ may be charged for entries received after 30th November 2010.
- 5.4 Entry fees paid at registration shall be paid in cash - S\$

6 RACE FORMAT

- 6.1 The Championship shall be a single discipline, *course racing*, “open entry” event.
- 6.2 Men and women, boys and girls, may race together.
- 6.3 Classes shall have separate starts.
- 6.4 Classes shall race a maximum 3 races per day, in a maximum 12 race series.
- 6.5 Three races are required to validate the championship for each class.

8 EQUIPMENT & EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 8.1 An Equipment Registration Form, which will be available at registration, shall be returned to the Event Equipment Inspector before the start of competition.

- 8.2 Equipment inspections may be made at any time during the event.
- 8.3 Unless otherwise directed by the organizing authority, boards and equipment shall be stored, launched and retrieved from the designated area at the event site.
- 8.4 **Techno 293.** A limited number of Techno 293 boards, sails and rigs, are available for Charter. Please contact Constant Wind at (65) 64455108 or ProShop@constantwind.com

9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions (SI's) will be available upon registration. Any changes to the SI's shall be approved by the Class Representative at the event.

10 COURSES

Courses will be as described in the sailing instructions.

11 PROTEST COMMITTEE

An 'Independent Protest Committee' will be appointed according to WCR 91(a).

12 SCORING

- 12.1 Scoring will be according to the WCR Appendix A, and using the Low Points Scoring System.
- 12.2 **Techno 293 Discards – This changes WCR Appendix A.**
 - 12.2.1 When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a board's series score shall be the total of her race scores.
 - 12.2.2 When from 4 to 10 races have been completed, a board's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - 12.2.3 When 11 or more races have been completed, a board's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

13 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall be registered at the race office. Limited charter may be available and may be applied for using the coach entry form.

14 SAFETY

- 14.1 Every competitor and support boat crewmember shall wear a personal flotation device that shall conform to the minimum standard of ISO 12402-5 (level 50), or as specified in the SI's.

15 PRIZES

- 15.1 Prizes will be awarded to the first three (five) competitors of each properly constituted class /division. Properly constituted divisions will be posted on the official notice board after the completion of the registration.
- 15.2 The first man and the first woman (boy/girl) in each class division in the Asian Championships will be declared “class/division.....**Asian Champion**”.
- 15.3 Titles shall only be awarded to competitors eligible to compete for an Asian national class association.

16 OFFICIAL CEREMONIES

Competitors are requested to attend the event's social functions; however, the organising authority may refuse entry to those whose standard of attire is not commensurate with the occasion.

17 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the event entirely at their own risk, see WCR 4 - Decision to Race. The organising authority or any of their officials or representatives or the sponsors or their officials or representatives will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the event.

18 INSURANCE

Each participating board shall be insured with adequate, and valid, third party liability insurance.

19 RIGHT TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

In registering for the event, competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority the right in perpetuity to make, use and show from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproduction of them, taken during the period of the event, for the said Event as defined in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions in which he/she participates without compensation.

A ACCOMMODATION

B AIR TRAVEL/TRANSPORTATION/TRANSFERS
