Two races for all divisions on the final day of racing at the 2010 European Championships. It was also the day that the first qualification places for the Singapore Youth Olympics were decided.

There were four places available in both the under 17 boys and girls divisions - only those sailors born in 1994 and 1995 could qualify their countries:

Boys - FRA, GBR, ISR, RUS

Girls - FRA, POL, ISR, ESP.

Predominantly light winds was the order of the day ensuring a very wide mixture of conditions tested the sailors in these championships. Consistency won the day!

A busy New Years Day for techno racers . . .

After the disappointment of no racing on day 3 it was a relief to be greeted by more sun, but less wind and waves, on day 4 of the European Championship! Originally scheduled as a "reserve day", full use was taken of a promising forecast to validate the championship for all techno fleets. It was the first opportunity for the under 15's to show their potential. Current world champion, Saskia Sills (GBR 956) heads the leaderboard after 3 races, ahead of Marta Maggetti (ITA 157) and twin sister Imogen Sills (GBR 561)

It is even closer in the boys fleet with just one point separating Michel Cittadini (ITA 38) from second placed Mattia Camboni (ITA 88).

The under 17 girls completed the first part of the days proceedings with a further 3 races, back to back. Cidane Humeau (FRA 6) had a perfect day with three firsts, which brought her within one point of overnight leader Lea mattei (FRA 161). Despite a poor race 4, by her standards, Hanna Idziak (POL 416) remains within striking distance of the leaders.

French sailors continue to dominate the Under 17 boys division, with the top 5 positions in the Gold Fleet. Gael Cousin (FRA 753) moves into pole position after a solid performance in the first day of finals, and despite a DNC in race 1 of the championship! However, there is very little to separate the following pack of french sailors, and it is all still to fight for.

Techno & Raceboard Europeans - Day Two

Day two of the championship produced wind and waves in abundance, but today the sail out of the harbour channel to the course area was "manageable" for most of the fleet. The Under 17 girls had a long wait before getting their championship started - but at 15.00 their chance came. Two races back to back and a tie break for first place separated Hanna Idziak (POL 416) from Lea Mattei (FRA 161).

However it was once again considered unsuitable for the under 15 racers and they were released for the day before the D flag for the under 17 girls.

Earlier in the day the decision was made to send out the Under 17 boys with the intention of 3 races back to back. Another tough day in prospect, but with a dire forecast for the final day of gold fleet qualification it was motivation enough to complete the minimum 4 races required to make the final cut.

French sailors dominated the top 3 positions in both yellow and blue groups - and lead the series after day 2:

- 1) Dante Chiapello (FRA 314)
- 2) Martin Olmeta (FRA 1)
- 3) Maxime Labat (FRA 0)

It was also a clean sweep of podium positions for France in the Techno Open. This fleet was sent to start with the Raceboard Youth and Masters, as two course areas were set today. Three back to back races and 3 bullets for Adrien Richard (FRA 601).

Three races, back to back, for both youth and masters in the Raceboard Fleets.

French sailors dominated in the youth division - and only one point separates Paul Hirtzmann (FRA 442) from Benjamin Longy (FRA1311). However they cannot ignore the chasing pack of nations that includes Sam Sills (GBR 60), the 2009 Techno 293 World and European Champion.

The Masters fleet may not be big, but 8 nations are represented, and after 3 races it is led by local hero Francisco "Paco" Manchon. Competition is just as fierce in this fleet - with Chris Gibson (GBR 0) and Pawel Frydrychowicz (POL 125) in close contact with the leader!

The Manchon family are also doing well in the RS:X women fleet with Blanca (ESP 1) holding pole position after posting the most consistent performance of the day.

Blanca is competing, along with 70+ other top olympic racers, in the Kim Lythgoe Memorial Race. Kim, a well respected coach and friend to many within the sport, was lost in late 2009; but his memory will forever be commemorated in the New Year's Race.

A tough first day at the Techno & Raceboard Europeans!

Challenging conditions faced the competitors at the first day of racing of the 2010 European Championship. The event hosted by the Andalusian Sailing Federation has attracted an entry of 300 boards.

189 Techno 293 competitors, a record entry for a Europeans, registered in what is also the first qualification regatta for the 2010 Youth Olympics.

Joining them were 45 Raceboard youths and masters; and 75 RS:X men and women competing in the Kim Lythgoe Memorial New Year's Race.

With 100 registered in the Techno under 17 boys it was necessary to separate the fleet into two groups - yellow and blue - and it was these racers who were called out to race on the only race area available to the race committee due to the wind and sea conditions.

Although sailing conditions were difficult over the course, the real challenge was sailing from the harbour and down the channel to the open water!

33 competitors started race one; and 31 finished. Many others tried, but failed, to reach the starting area, in what became increasingly difficult conditions. There was no disgrace in recording DNS in such conditions. Full credit to the race committee, coaches and support crews for the efficient management of the day's racing.
